



Wig Care and Styling Tips

Shampooing

Use a shampoo that is specifically formulated for synthetic hair. This is very important to maintain the quality and style of the wig. These items can be found on-line or at a beauty supply store.

- Fill your sink with 1 gallon of COOL water and one capful of shampoo.
- Place your wig in the basin and let it soak for 3 to 5 minutes.
- Gently swish it up and down - do not rub or wring.
- Drain the sink and carefully rinse the wig in clear cool water until all shampoo is removed.

Conditioning

Use a conditioner or conditioning spray that is specifically formulated for synthetic hair.

- After washing and rinsing, refill your sink with 1 gallon of cool water.
- Add 1 capful of wig conditioner OR 6 to 8 pumps of conditioning spray into the water and on the wig. The amount will vary depending on wig length and texture.
- Let your wig soak 5 minutes.
- Gently rinse your wig with cool water.

Drying

***Do NOT twist or wring your wig, as this will harm the fibers.

***Do NOT brush or comb your wig while it is wet. Brush ONLY when completely dry.

- Thoroughly blot the entire wig dry on a large towel. Fold the remaining portion of the towel over it and gently press out the water.
- Place your fingers inside the wig to anchor and shake it vigorously to further release any excess of remaining water. This will save on drying time.
- Place your wig on its Styrofoam stand to drip dry. If you want more volume or body, then flip your wig upside down and hang dry. A clothes hanger over the tub works well.
- Once dry, shake gently and softly brush your wig to its original style.

Styling, Cutting, Accessorizing and Storing

- Use your fingers or a steel pronged brush to style or tease your wig. Avoid using a plastic comb/brush, as they do not glide through the wig fibers.
- Do worry about getting every hair in place, as this can end up making the finest of wigs look "wiggly".
- If you decide you'd like to cut your wig, ask your hairdresser to help you.
- Add barrettes, braids, headscarves or other fun accessories that express your style.
- There are light holding hairspray products designed specifically for wigs and synthetic hair.
- Store your wig on its stand when not in use.

Fitting Your Wig

- The pointed or angular tabs inside the wig will be your guide every time you put it on or straighten while on. Hold them as you flip your wig over and place your wig on your head. Each tab (right and left) should be placed behind each ear. Let the wig fall into place and use your fingers or steel pronged brush to get the part aligned. Tease the top or sides for volume.

VERY IMPORTANT WIG DONT'S

- Don't use any heat styling devices: hairdryer, curlers, curling iron, flat iron, etc.
- NEVER expose your wig to excessive heat sources, such as a hot open oven door, boiling water or steam from dishwasher, gas range, clothes dryer, deep fryer, BBQ grill, campfire, fireplace, a lit cigarette or lighter, saunas, Jacuzzi. Keep your wig away from ALL sources of heat or open flame.
